THURSDAY 11.30 pm BBC 2: RACISM IN THE RANKS

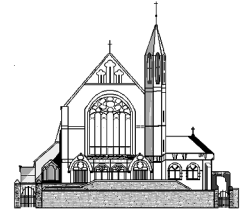
Explores complaints of racism and bullying in the British Army.

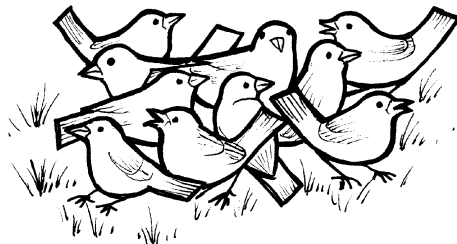
