problems by talking to a trusted friend. His colleague, also named Chris, from Liverpool FC charity showed us a couple of experiments which supported our understanding of how worries can weigh us down... Thanks to Moyo, Olivia and Sena for volunteering for the activity! We chatted lots about mental health and the different types of problems we can face such as: stress, anxiety, worry, anger,



OCD and phobias. We thought about strategies that we could use to overcome these problems. Regular exercise, a good night's sleep, talking and socialising and getting into nature were just some of the great ideas that we came up with. Before leaving he signed our class football and gave lots of us a signed autograph in our doodle books. What a brilliant afternoon we had!

Watch out for dangerous toys this Christmas

The number of dangerous toys sold online to unsuspecting families is on the increase - so it's important to be extra cautious when buying Christmas presents this year.

Worryingly, if you buy from a third party seller via one of the well-known online marketplaces, toys might not meet UK safety standards.

Online marketplaces are simply offering a shop window to sellers around the world and aren't legally required to check if a toy is safe before allowing it to be sold.

Dangers can include:

- Magnets so strong they can burn through a child's gut if swallowed
- Long cords that can strangle a child
- Dangerous levels of chemicals
- * Small parts that can choke or suffocate
- * Easy access to button batteries that can get stuck in a child's food pipe, cause internal bleeding and even death.

You may be looking for bargains online this year due to shop closures and financial pressures caused by Covid-19, so we're sharing tips to help you buy toys safely.

If you are able to, then **buy direct** via the websites of well-known brand names.

If you are buying from an online marketplace, enter a reputable brand name when you search for the toy you want, to be sure it's safe.

Use a tissue to turn off the tap. Dry hands thoroughly.




NHS COVID-19 app, now available to download for free in England and Wales, is the fastest way to see if you're at risk from coronavirus. The faster you know, the quicker you can alert and protect your loved ones and community.



The app has a number of tools to protect you, including contact tracing, local area alerts and venue check-in. It uses proven technology from Apple and Google, designed to protect every user's privacy. If your postcode district becomes high risk, the app will let you know – and give you advice on what action to take.

- If you come into close contact with another user who reports a positive test result the app will send you an anonymous alert
- A built-in QR scanner lets you check in to venues quickly and easily
- You can check your symptoms in the app and if they suggest you may have coronavirus, the app is an easy way to get tested
- Any data shared with the app is held on your phone
- Nobody will know who or where you are. You can delete the app and all data at any time
- The NHS COVID-19 app is the fastest way to see if you're at risk from the virus. The faster you know, the quicker you can alert and protect your loved ones.
