'How many resources are spent on weaponry, especially nuclear weapons

that could be used for more significant priorities such as ensuring the safety of individuals, the promotion of peace and integral human development, the fight against poverty, and the provision of health care.

Global problems, like the present Covid-19 pandemic and climate change, have only made these challenges all the more evident. What a courageous decision it would be to 'establish a 'Global Fund' with the money spent on weapons and other military expenditures, in order to permanently eliminate hunger and contribute to the development of the poorest countries!'

Pope Francis concludes his message, urging:
'We never yield to the temptation to disregard others,
especially those in greatest need, and to look the other way.
Instead, may we strive daily, in concrete and practical ways,
to form a community composed of brothers and sisters
who accept and care for one another.'
