THURSDAY 7.30 pm ITV1: SECRETS OF YOUR ONLINE CHRISTMAS

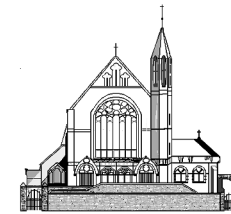
With the second lockdown causing many to shop online, this report
