#### POPE FRANCIS HAS THROWN DOWN THE GAUNTLET!

In an unflinching message he is calling for a new world order with human dignity at its centre. In his latest letter to the world, FRATELLI TUTTI, he tells us that politics is failing the poorest with many political decisions plunging them even further into poverty, suffering and despair. He warns against a rampant culture of individualism, nationalism, economic models that line the pockets of the rich and our silence on poverty, war, and systems that dehumanise individuals.

Pope Francis' vision of the future is one rooted in human solidarity:

'Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community. It means that the lives of all are more important than the appropriation of goods by a few. It also means combatting the structural causes of poverty, inequality, the lack of work, land and housing, the denial of social and labour rights. It means confronting the destructive effects of the empire of money...'

Pope Francis holds up a vision for real and lasting change, by calling on us all to build community at every level - personal, societal and global, where walls of fear and distrust are replaced by a 'culture of encounter', and our solidarity with other's restore's human dignity.
