GOSPEL THOUGHTS John 3:14-21

If you cannot swim you must not jump into the canal to save someone. We must learn to swim. If we want to help, love or work with other people we must tackle our own skills and abilities, otherwise we will double the trouble instead of healing the mess.



Jesus tries to explain to Nicodemus that we must change and live for others, surrender, perhaps die to self for others. It is counter-cultural when we naturally want to preserve self. Jesus is gathering courage to love his enemies who would kill him.

Jesus is not mad but knows that God loves everyone. Those who resist being this 'love for everyone' have to live with the violent consequences: darkness. Those who surrender to be God's love for everyone have to love the violent ones, perhaps die forgiving those enemies - this is one aspect of light.

On our Lenten journey we will profit from knowing God's love for us as we struggle to be God's love for others.
