A Palestinian mother enduring the current conflict in Gaza wrote:

'Tonight I put the kids to sleep in our bedroom so that when we die, we die together and no one of us would live to mourn the loss of the others.'

Policies of governments around the world, including the UK, are denying mothers the right to see their children live without fear and grow up without painful trauma and violence.

More than half of the UK's exports go to the Middle East.

Exports from the UK to Israel include sniper and assault rifles, pistols, weapon sights, targeting equipment, ammunition for small arms and grenades, smoke canisters, tanks, combat and military helicopters, military support and combat aircraft - all of which help arm the disproportionate and massive Israeli assault on Palestinians and their oppression on a daily basis.

We cannot just lament the situation in Palestine - we are called to act.
