GOSPEL THOUGHTS Mark 4: 26-34

It is interesting to note that in neither of these two parables does Jesus attempt to define exactly in human terms what the Kingdom of God is. Perhaps Jesus wants to remind us that it is God's Kingdom and God who is in control, not us.

However Jesus does make it clear in both parables that we can, and are invited to, share in the benefits of the Kingdom of God which is already here and pre-exists us. We can receive physical and spiritual nourishment from the Kingdom of God like those in the parable of the seed who reap the harvest. We can be given physical and spiritual shelter and protection by the Kingdom of God like the birds of the air in the parable of the mustard tree who shelter in its branches.

Nourishment, shelter and protection flow from human co-operation sharing and compassion which are God's values within us, whether we are aware of God or not. We are invited to put these values into practise, in no matter how small a way, and to reap the benefits.
