### THURSDAY 10.45pm ITV1: FEARLESS: THE WOMEN FIGHTING PUTIN

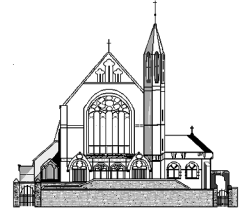
