On Tuesday, year 6 visited St Michael's Church for a collective worship. The children were very excited






Our **PE** lessons have had us behaving like gymnasts as we have been develop our core strength and improving our balancing skills.

Our **Music** lessons have got us all feeling the Christmas spirit as we have been practicing carols ready for a service later this term.






The children below have gone Above and Beyond in school this week. They have been rewarded with a certificate and a hot chocolate with cream, marshmallows and biscuits.





