As I said in last week's newsletter.... 'Unfortunately, with a heavy heart, I have made the decision that we will not be able to invite parents and carers into school to watch the Christmas performances and nativity plays. I know this will be very disappointing for our families but it is my priority to keep children, staff and our school families as safe as possible, especially as we lead up to the Christmas period.'

This decision has been reinforced more recently by the additional Covid measures we have been asked to implement by Public Health Liverpool. When we have looked at these against our own risk assessment we would NOT be able to implement some of the Covid measures we have been instructed to, to create a safe environment to permit parents into school to watch the performances live.

We will film all of the performances and will share with parents/carers via our school YouTube channel. More information will follow about how to access this.

Subway and lack of safe crossing across West Derby Road

Last Friday we had a visit from several Liverpool councillors and our local MP Paula Baker to once again look at the significant health and safety issues we have continued to raise with them about the subway and lack of safe crossing on West Derby Road. They all agreed it was an unacceptable situation and that action was needed. As a school we will hold them to these actions in every way we can. But we need your help too. 

You May Need To See Someone ...

At times children and young people may become distressed and need to be seen in an emergency. The following is available for children and young people in Liverpool:

GP OUT OF HOURS SERVICE

A GP is available when your local surgery is closed during evenings, weekends and Bank Holidays. If you need urgent healthcare which cannot wait until the next working day, you can access a GP via the GP Out of Hours service. Call your Doctor's surgery on the usual number and you will either be transferred to the Out of Hours service, or there will be an answer phone message with details of how to access it. The out of hours service operator will take details of your call and pass these to a doctor or nurse, who will contact you and, depending on your circumstances, will offer you one of the following options:

ACCIDENT & EMERGENCY: CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE AGED 0-16 YEARS

If a child or young person becomes distressed or shows signs of becoming a risk to others or themselves they should be taken to <u>A&E at Alder Hey Children's Foundation Trust</u> following receipt of parental/carer permission. The Specialist mental health service provided by this trust operates a duty on-call system and a clinician will be called to attend A&E to support and provide an assessment of the child or young person. A Psychiatrist on-call system operates through the evening.
