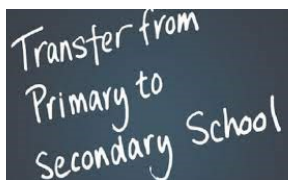


First Holy Communion

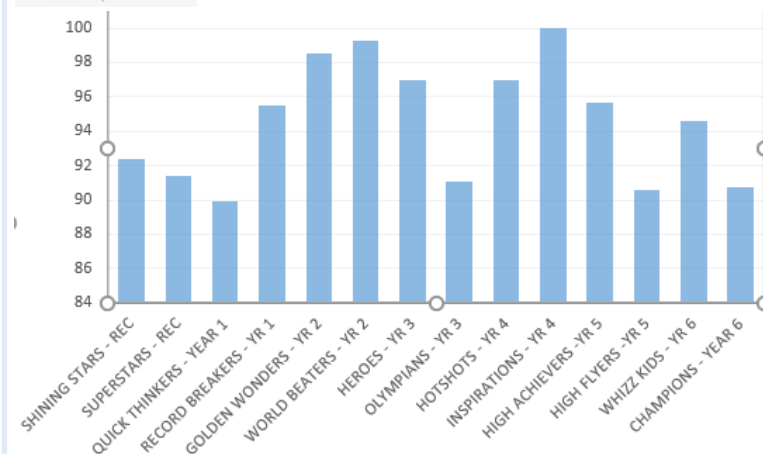

Asylum Link Merseyside is based in St Anne's presbytery next to St Anne's Church in Overbury Street, Wavertree. It is a safe space for Asylum Seekers and Refugees, to meet, relax and find out about the community they have been dropped into. They offer a wide range of **services** which are centred on the principles of Friendship and Welcome. These include access to other agencies delivering refugee services on site, the Merseyside Refugee Support Network MRSN, Merseyside Network for Change, MNfC, and the Greater Manchester Immigration Aid Unit, GMIAU.

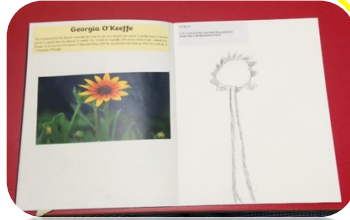

Year 1 Focus

In **Art** we have begun focussing on the artist Georgia o' Keefe. We looked at some of her beautiful paintings of flowers and discussed how bright and vibrant they are. We then had our first go at sketching a flower. Check out some of our sketches!

It's been a busy half term for Year 1. The great weather for most of the week has meant we have managed to get outside and do lots of our work in the sunshine. The children have enjoyed Music, Maths, stories and games all in the fantastic weather. Both Miss McEntee and Mr Nice can't believe how much the children have grown during the year and how independent they have become. They have come back from the half term holiday ready and keen to learn. **Well done Year 1!**

This year we have been lucky to have a **brand new shared area in Year 1**. This is a space for both classes to develop in all areas, through a play based curriculum. We have been given the opportunity to develop our communication and interaction skills in a nurturing, vibrant environment. Check out some of the things we have been up to in our shared area.



In **Music** we enjoyed a beautiful music lesson in the sun. We learnt a new song 'I can sing a rainbow' and added some sign language to it. We have loved using our voices to create different pitches and rhythms.



In **Maths** we have been doing some recall work on addition. As we started to practice our jumping to add on, we found that the playground makes a great space to use some really big number lines. We are also getting so much better now at counting in multiples of 2,5 and 10.



In **PE** we started our new gymnastics topic this week by getting the new mats out and learning how to use them safely. We were so excited to explore how we could travel and roll across the mats in different ways.



New School Uniform Supplier

Dear Parents/Carers,

We are pleased to inform you that we have a new school uniform supplier! After feedback from parents regarding the cost and quality of the uniform from Laser we have spoken to other schools in the area and looked at samples from various companies. As a result of our thorough research we have decided to use **Lisa's School Wear**. The uniform is better quality and a more competitive price.

In light of the new law regarding school uniforms, we will expand our current school uniform to include both the branded uniform from our new supplier and non-branded uniform that can be purchased from a supermarket. For example, plain navy jumpers and cardigans and plain navy skirts or pinafores. The PE kit can be purchased from school supplier or supermarket (plain blue or white t shirt and plain blue shorts). From September children cannot wear commercial branded sports wear.

The school tie will still need to be purchased from the uniform supplier.

This is totally your choice. As a school we will be delighted to see our children in either the school branded uniform or uniform purchased from supermarket.

Uniform will be available to purchase from Lisa's Schoolwear from **Monday 7th June**. Our previous supplier, Laser will still be selling our uniform while stock lasts.

What to do if your child has Covid Symptoms?

If your child develops a new and continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell they must stay at home to begin isolation – the isolation period includes the day the symptoms started and the next 10 full days.

Please inform school on the first morning of absence and

keep school updated throughout. You must arrange for them to have a PCR Covid test as soon as possible. Further details of how to book a test is available on the link: <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>

Other members of the household, including any siblings, should self-isolate. If your child has a negative result and is feeling well they should return to school. People who are sick with coronavirus may have other symptoms like the flu, including body-aches, headaches, sore throat and tiredness, shortness of breath, nausea or diarrhoea. If your child has these symptoms it is important you also consider booking them a PCR test. If they don't have the main symptoms of coronavirus, they do not need to isolate until they get their result, however they do need to continue to take the usual measures to protect and others from illness, such as regular hand washing.
