ENGLAND
It's coming home!

The England national football team are a team who play association football for England. They play their matches in England at Wembley Stadium. They won the FIFA World Cup in 1966 when they beat West Germany by 4 goals to 2 at the old Wembley Stadium. On 13 June 2017, England lost a friendly match 3-2 away to France.

Early history – one of the first national teams
The national team of England was formed at the same time as Scotland's, and that makes it one of the two oldest national football teams. They played their first matches against each other already in 1870 and are therefore also the oldest in the early modern history of the game. The very first game between the two nations was played on March 5, 1870, and the ground was The Oval in London. Quite symbolic, the match ended with a draw, 1-1.

ENGLAND:

I'm sure most of the people in the UK are rooting for England at this moment. England are a strong team and are fortunate enough to be playing in the semi-finals of the 2020 Euros!

The England national football team and represent England in men's international football since the first international match in 1872.

History: 1872
England's first international football match was against Scotland in 1872.

Denmark

Denmark is a national team controlled by the Danish Football Association. They won the 1992 UEFA Euro Cup. They play in Parken Stadium.

Self-isolating?

You could qualify
for £500 support

Test and Trace support payment for parents/guardians. If your child has been told to self-isolate as a result of being in close contact with someone in their school bubble, who has tested positive, you may be entitled to a payment. Parents or guardians who are not legally required to self-isolate can apply for a Test and Trace Support expanded scheme payment of £500 if you need to take time off work to care for your child, if they have been told to self-isolate on or after 8th March 2021. Please don't guess, get a test!

If you have any **MAIN SYMPTOMS** of Covid-19, such as a high temperature, a new continuous cough or loss or change to your sense of smell or taste stay at home and book a PCR test. You need to isolate until you know the result.

Book at gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test or call 119.

If you feel unwell with **ANY OTHER SYMPTOMS** such as a headache, stuffed or runny nose, tiredness or weakness, aches and pains, sore throat or diarrhoea you need to take a rapid home test.

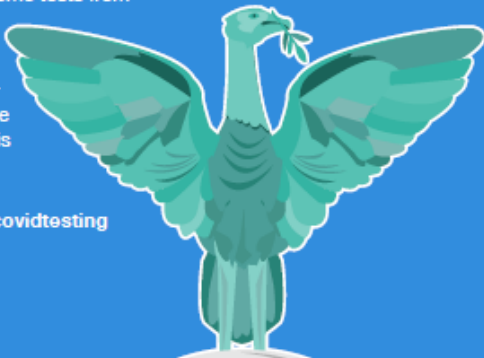
If the result is positive, then book a PCR test and stay at home until you know the result.

If you do need to isolate after a positive test, remember support is available - visit liverpool.gov.uk/coronavirus for details.

If you have **NO SYMPTOMS** you should still get tested twice a week.

You can collect rapid home tests from your local pharmacy or order them online. You can also visit community test sites or attend one of the mobile testing vehicles. There is no need to book an appointment.

Let's take our city back. One vaccination at a time.

Everyone over 18 can now book their vaccine.

By getting vaccinated you are protecting yourself and others from getting seriously ill.

Vaccines are shown to be safe and effective against the virus, including new variants.

It reduces your risk of spreading the virus to someone else.

You need two doses for maximum protection, so make sure you get both.

Alongside vaccines and testing we can also reduce our risk and stop the spread by keeping 2 metres apart from people we don't live with and meeting our friends and family outdoors.

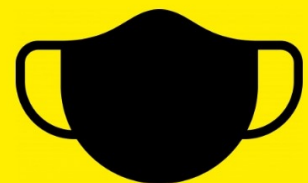
