We have settled back into our new half-term and we are excited to learn and play with our friends. Over the last half term we have settled fantastically into our new environment and are becoming more independent each day. We have been learning how to do the 'coat flick' to put on our coats; where our toys go when we tidy; and we've even found our name cards during registration.





We have enjoyed meeting and playing with new friends, especially in our new home corner. We enjoyed playing with our small -world people and trains and tracks, developing our imagination and making up different games.





In phonics we are focusing on rhyming songs and making different beats with our bodies. Ask us to sing some of our rhyming songs at home (you can find these on the BBC website). This is helping us to develop our listening skills each day.

We are enjoying lots of counting rhymes this term, particularly 'Five Currant Buns' and 'Five Little Speckled Frogs'. We like to sing these together and when we are playing with our friends. In maths we are also focusing on counting five lolly sticks each day and we are beginning to recognise three sticks when we take two away. See if you can practise counting five objects at home.

Today we talked about bonfire night and we even heard some loud crackling and banging noises from outside. Some children then used black play-dough and glitter to represent the sky and pressed pom-poms and pip cleaners into it to make a firework display.






The children below have gone Above and Beyond in school this week. They have been rewarded with a certificate and a hot chocolate with cream, marshmallows and biscuits.
