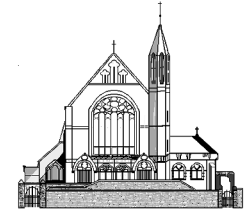

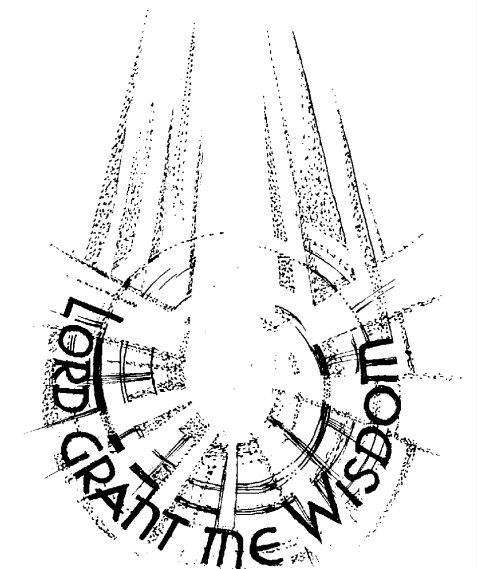
GOSPEL THOUGHTS Mark 10:17-27
