PEACE THOUGHTS

In Pope Francis' World Day of Peace message (sent to all foreign ministers throughout the world), he outlined three 'paths for building a lasting peace': promoting dialogue between generations, investing in education and improving labour conditions.

He said the world had witnessed a 'significant reduction' in education funding in recent years, while military spending had soared beyond

Cold War levels.

He wrote, 'It is high time that governments develop economic policies aimed at inverting the proportion of public funds spent on education

and weaponry.

He called for a new alliance between the young and elderly to address the problems of isolation and self-absorption heightened by the coronavirus pandemic. Of the labour market, he recognised that young people entering the job market and recently unemployed adults presently face bleak prospects and that migrant workers have been left exposed, to various forms of slavery with no system of welfare to protect them.'

The pope observed that 'only one in three people working today enjoy a system of social protection, or benefit from it only in limited ways,' while violence and organized crime are rising in many places. He went on: 'It is more urgent than ever to promote, throughout our world, decent and dignified working conditions, oriented to the common good and to the safeguarding of creation.' and ended, 'May more and more men and women strive daily, with quiet humility and courage, to be artisans of peace'.
