The Wedding Feast at Cana

There was a wedding in the town of Cana in Galilee and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine had given out, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no more wine."

"The most you can do is what I tell you to do," Jesus replied. "My time has not yet come."

His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

There were jars there used for ritual washing, and for this purpose, six silver jugs were there, each one large enough to hold about a gallon of water.

Jesus' mother told the servants, "Fill these jars with water."

They filled them to the brim, and when he told them, "Now draw some water and pour it into the jars," they did so. The water, which Jesus had turned into wine, was there. The wine was better than the wine that had come from the well of Cana. The servants who had drawn out the water knew to be called the disciples.

Everyone else who was at the wedding saw the sign that Jesus had done there. He turned water into wine, and he did so in a sign that showed he was the Messiah, the Son of God.

Jesus performed his first miracle at Cana in Galilee, where he revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him.


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# Year 4—Hot Shots
