This week our **Collective Worship** themes have been **Integrity, Respect and Aspiration** - as we celebrated the feast days of 3 saints - Saint Louise de Marillac, St Patrick and St Joseph the Worker. The children have had an opportunity to reflect on the lives of the 3 saints and their relationship with the Word of God.

Integrity, Respect & Aspiration:
 Luke 9:28-36 The Transfiguration



"About a week after he had said these things, Jesus took Peter, John, and James with him and went up a hill to pray. While he was praying, his face changed its appearance, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly two men were there talking with him. They were Moses and Elijah, who appeared in heavenly glory and talked with Jesus about the way in which he should soon fulfil God's purpose by dying in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were sound asleep, but they came on and saw Jesus glory and the two men who were standing with him. As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, how good it is that we are here! We will make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He did not realize what he was saying. While he was still speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them with its shadow, and the disciples were afraid to come over to him. "A voice said from the cloud, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen—listen to him!" When the voice stopped, there was Jesus all alone. The disciples were quiet about all this and told no one at that time anything they had seen.

She followed this all her life - giving service to others

When he had finished, Jesus explained exactly what his action meant.

If I then, the Lord and Master, have washed your feet, you should wash each other's feet. I have given you an example, so that you may copy what I have done for you."



Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland.

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they were married she found she was expecting a child through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Joseph, being a just man, didn't want to put her to shame, so he decided to leave her quietly.

But as he thought about this an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for the baby she is carrying is from the Holy Spirit.

she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet Isaiah: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel" which means, God is with us.

When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, she had a son; and he named him Jesus.



We learned about how the people of Athens and Sparta lived and how they were similar and different. Some of the facts blew our minds!



Did you know that in Sparta, 7 year old boys were forced to go into the army? That is the same age as some of us! We discussed how we would feel if that was us.





