New Crossing for school.

As you will have seen we have a new school crossing on West Derby Road. This is such great news and will make a significant improvement to the safe crossing of this very busy main road for many of our families.

As a school we have been campaigning for this safe crossing for many years. Over this period we have sought the support of councillors, local MPs and the LA. Last year we invited Paula Barker, MP to visit our school and support our campaign for a safe crossing outside our school on West Derby Road. She met year 6 pupils who shared a presentation about the problems with the subway and the head/deputy pupils led her on a walkabout to highlight the issues. Paula Barker MP, fully supported this campaign and with further support from Liverpool councillors together have greatly helped us to secure this great new facility. *A sincere thank you to all those who have supported us with our crusade!*

So far we have had positive feedback from parents. All being well it will be fully completed soon. Everyone in our school community and wider will benefit from this crossing.

This weeks theme for worship has been centred around the passing of Queen Elizabeth. II The children have been learning about her life, offering up prayers and studying relevant passages from the bible.




Importance of Attendance

slower speeds, safer streets



Dear Parents/Guardians,

It is the start of a new academic year and for some pupils a new beginning at the school. The school environment is a safe secure place for your children to attend but we as parents and guardians also have a responsibility to try and improve the accessibility of pupils arriving to school. Inconsiderate and dangerous parking is one of the biggest safety concerns from parents outside Primary Schools. Parked vehicles can hide children from passing drivers and stop children from being able to see approaching traffic. Almost half of the young children injured as pedestrians have had their view of the road blocked by a parked car.

How would you feel if your parking contributed towards a child being injured?

Remember pupils need to see and be seen when crossing the roads so think seriously about the location of the school and neighbourhood and consider ways you can help as a parent/guardian to improve their road safety. If you use a vehicle to drop off and pick up your child from School, please consider parking further away from the entrance & exits in a **safe legal place** and walk the remainder of the journey.

Do Not Park on

- School Keep Clear Zig Zags
- Double/Single Yellow Lines
- Close to junctions / Drop Kerbs
- Near School Crossing Patrol locations
- On Pavements
- In front of resident driveways

You are the one who will be with your children at the roadside every day. When you are out with your child you will have good opportunities to reinforce the road safety messages. Please think about telling your child about the importance of finding safer places to cross, stopping behind the kerb, looking, listening, and thinking, holding their hands even if using a lollipop person or pedestrian facility. Making sure they have good visibility, taking their hoods down and no distractions with phones or friends when near roads. This will help your child to develop good road safety habits at an early age and reinforce your own road safety awareness.

Think about the safety of all Road Users.

Reception Class and Secondary School Admissions for 2023

The Reception and Year 7 admissions application window for 2023 is now open for eligible parents/carers to make their applications.

It is important to apply on time to maximise all chances of securing your preferred school.

The application closing date for Year 7 Secondary places is 31st October 2022

The application closing date for Reception places is 15th January 2023

How does this work?

You can only apply online for **Primary Reception** place or a **Secondary Year 7** place for schools if you live in Liverpool. If you live outside Liverpool and want to apply for a school here, you must apply through the education authority where you live. For all other places please see our Other applications page.

• Once you have created an online applications account, you can apply for up to three schools for up to five schools for Secondary Year 7.

Some schools (mainly faith schools) also ask you to complete additional paper forms that must be sent directly to them.

Step 1

- a. Find the schools you are interested in.
- b. Read the relevant policies for each school.

If the school has supplementary forms download them, if available. Some schools (mainly faith schools and some academies) require you to send additional forms directly to them.

Before you apply you must register for an account first. If you have used the system before to apply for a school, you will already be registered. If you have forgotten your password, just select 'forgotten password' to reset it.


