'This is what happens today: if the investments in the banks fall slightly... we call it a tragedy... what can be done? But if people die of hunger, if they have nothing to eat, if they have poor health, it does not matter!

This is our crisis today!

'While the income of a minority is increasing exponentially, that of the majority is crumbling. This imbalance results from ideologies which uphold the absolute autonomy of markets and financial speculation, and thus deny the right of control to states, which are charged with providing for the common good. A new, invisible and at times virtual, tyranny is established, one which unilaterally and irremediably imposes its own laws and rules.'

Address to new Vatican ambassadors, May 16

This quote puts it all out there. Too much money is in the hands of too few, while the vast majority struggle to get by. This is a direct result of ideologies that put the free market before everything else, including the duty of the government to ensure that people's basic needs are met.

The Holy Father says that money must serve, not rule!


