- Your child should never touch, throw, play with or light fireworks.
- When you're watching the fireworks displays, stand well back from any firework that has been lit, even if it has not gone off.
- If you have any pets, please ensure you keep them indoors.


How do you stay safe around bonfires?

- Stand far back at a safe distance from the fire with your child.
- Children should never attempt to help an adult light a bonfire. Bonfires can be unpredictable and extremely dangerous therefore a child should never assist in lighting, even if the bonfire is relatively small.

Hello and welcome to the World Beaters classroom. We are glad to be back after the half term holiday and are impressing our teachers with how well we have settled back in the routines of the day. We hope that you enjoy finding out about what we have been learning over the past few weeks! Mrs Roscoe and Miss Sharpes

In Science this week we have been finding out which material would be the best for cleaning the tables.

We decided that we needed to test the absorbency of the material to help us to answer our question.

We found out that the sponge was the most absorbent.

In English, this week, we linked our writing to our History topic: the Great Fire of London. We became reporters and interviewed 'significant people' about the Great Fire of London. These questions helped us to plan our piece of writing. Just like Samuel Pepys, we decided to write a diary entry about the events.

In Maths, we have been partitioning whole numbers into two parts using base ten to help us. We have been using the part-whole model to help us with our calculations.

In Come and See we have been learning about the Sacrament of Baptism. We have role played a Baptism and talked about the important symbols and prayers.
