It was so lovely to see you all and hear about the positive feedback your child/children had received from their teacher/teachers. We also had many positive comments about the school too!

Thank you also to those who popped into the junior hall to for the 'Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE)' Consultation workshops for parents and carers.

Pupil School Attendance and Punctuality

At St Michael's we encourage the highest possible levels of attendance and punctuality for all our children. To gain the greatest benefit from their education, it is vital that all pupils

attend regularly and on time. There is a clear link between the attendance and attainment of pupils.

Children are defined as persistent absentees by the Department of education (DfE) if their attendance falls below 90%.

90% attendance is the equivalent to a pupil missing one half day per week or approximately 118 lessons per year!

It is our responsibility as a school to intervene and where we can, provide support.

Staff and I will continue to meet with parents/carers of children who are poor attenders regularly to discuss how we can together improve daily attendance.

Also, we will send a morning text message to the parents/carers of children who are persistent absentees to encourage daily attendance.

As a school we define regular attendance as 97% or above.



Record Breakers





Anti Bullying Week


Next week is Anti Bullying week, we have an exciting week of activities planned. All classes will be doing daily activities on Anti Bullying and will have photographs and write ups in
