

This 1851 Map is from the Early Victorian period. It shows West Derby Road in the centre. Some interesting features are the workhouse on Mill Road; zoological gardens (gates were close to where Farnworth Street is now); Whitefield House and strawberry gardens on Boundary Lane; Newsham House on far right; the open fields where the school now is and all around to the east of the city.


### SPOTTED! SHINING STARS IN VICTORIAN GARMENTS!

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














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
A DECADE FOR EVERY CLASS! As well as looking at the Victorian Era, every year group was given a different decade of our history to study and enjoy.

They learned about 1940s fashion and even had a go at learning some dance moves from the 1940s. They thoroughly enjoyed it!





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
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#### INSPIRATIONS




### **CHAMPIONS**
