# Nursery



### **Settling and Learning Routines**

Since returning to nursery, the children have settled fantastically. The children are beginning to make some lovely friendships and we have been focusing on how to play alongside each other and learning how to share equipment. We are trying realty hard to become independent, taking off our own coats and putting on our own aprons and shoes.

Throughout our play time, we have been learning how to use different resources and how to play alongside our friends. Over the last four weeks, we have settled back into nursery life, and we are allowing our friends to play with us. We have been working hard on solving conflict with each other through discussions and talking about how some of our friends may feel in different situations.

#### Maths

In maths, we have been focusing on counting to 5. We have discovered what a 5-frame is and have started to use it to help us find out how many of a certain object there is. When counting, we are learning to line items up and say one number per each object — this helps us count accurately.

### Writing

We love mark-making in nursery; we have been building up the muscles in our arms and hands to support our writing. We have built these muscles through using big brushes outside, taking part in 'dough disco' and drawing with chalk outside. We are focusing on drawing simple shapes, such as circles, lines, and squares to represent our ideas. We are even trying to give meaning to our marks.

### Reading

We are beginning to sit for story time and have enjoyed reading 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' and 'Goldilocks and the Three Little Bears' this half term. Please continue to read with your child at home to support their language development.







### RE

In Come and See we have been learning about 'Birthdays'. We have been making birthday hats, cards and decorating cakes to celebrate this topic.

Thank you for your continued support each day, it is always appreciated. A reminder to ensure your child has a spare pair of clothes in nursery every day in case they get wet. This bag must include: a top, trousers, underwear, and socks.

### Stay and Play

This half-term, our 'Stay and Play' sessions have started again; it was so lovely to see so many parents at our first event. 'Stay and Play' takes place every Friday, you just need to come in, hang your coat/bag on your child's peg and then have fun! We love getting to know more about your child and seeing you play alongside them.

8:45am - 9:15am (morning nursery)

12:20pm - 12:50pm (afternoon nursery)

# School Council Playground Walk-around

Our School Council have decided that, as part of their duties, they will perform a regular walk-around of the school premises with Mr Doyle, our school caretaker. It allows the children an opportunity to give their input on health and safety issues, point out areas they feel could be improved and have a say into how the yard changes in the future. Their findings and suggestions are recorded in a book which is left in Mr Doyle's office in order for him to act on the children's ideas.

A new social media campaign, #SleighNoToLoanSharks, is being launched to alert people about the dangers of using loan sharks and help prevent them from falling into their traps in the run up to Christmas. Tony Quigley, Head of the England Illegal Money Lending Team, said: "Loan sharks are doing untold damage in local communities, and we must do all we can to stop them. With their ruthless tactics, these predators are threatening vulnerable families, driving them deeper into debt, and pulling entire communities into an endless cycle of despair. "At a time when families are under extreme cost pressures with mounting living costs, we are deeply concerned that those who are already struggling to make ends meet could be targeted by these predatory lenders. "Our campaign aims to break this cycle by helping people understand the risks of loan sharks, what they can do if they feel threatened and where they can turn for help and support. The Stop Loan Sharks 24/7 Helpline offers confidential advice and support to anyone affected by illegal money lending. We know how stressful and frightening this experience can be. We can give you support on how to deal with this problem and help find a way forward."

Follow these safety tips to protect yourself and loved ones from loan sharks:

- 1. If you're struggling to make ends meet and need cash fast, the thought of a loan shark might seem tempting, but remember these lenders are not your friends. Debt can quickly spiral out of control it's important to think carefully before taking out a loan and consider other options.
- 2. Never send money or give credit card, online account details or copies of personal documents to anyone you don't know or trust. This information is valuable so make sure you protect it from criminals who can use it to find and stalk you, harass you or threaten those you love.
- 3. If you're thinking about borrowing money, it's important to check that your lender is genuine. Loan sharks operate illegally without the correct permission from the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA). Do your research first and check the firm or person you're dealing with is listed on the Financial Services Register.
- 4. When exploitative loan sharks are preying on hardship, it's vital for people to know there is an ethical, local, not-for-profit alternative available. Credit unions are a lifeline for many people, with their services helping members to save regularly, borrow responsibly and keep track of their finances. There are other community lenders who are mostly not for profit, and who reinvest any surpluses into serving vulnerable customers, which can be found on https://www.findingfinance.org.uk/
- 5. Getting trapped in a never-ending spiral of debt after borrowing from a loan shark can have devastating consequences, not only on your finances but also on most other aspects of your life, including your mental health, work and relationships with your family and friends. If you're worried about a friend or family member, or if you need help yourself, Stop Loan Sharks can offer confidential advice and support.
