Please remember that good hand and respiratory hygiene are important for stopping the spread of any germs. Please teach your child/children how to wash their hands properly with soap for 20 seconds, and using a tissue to catch coughs and sneezes.

In school we will also support children with these techniques. We will increase our cleaning routines too.

Can I please reassure parents and carers if your child or another child becomes unwell in school, they are assessed by one our trained first aiders and the parent/carer will be called to collect them to go home. All staff are fully aware of the symptoms related to Scarlet Fever and will be vigilant at all times.

As a school we take the welfare of all our children exceptionally seriously.
