EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS




Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.



We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.

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Class Focus: Nursery



Maths

In maths we have been learning how to count objects and say one number for each object. We have been trying hard to remember how many objects we have counted when we get to the last object. We have also enjoyed making repeated patterns with objects, for example: stick, pinecone, stick pinecone.







RE

Over the last few weeks in RE we have been focusing on our topic, 'Gather'. We have read a story about a child that had to stay off nursery because they were unwell and how they missed learning and playing with their friends. We then explored what things in nursery we liked to do together with our friends

PSE

In Nursery we have been learning about strategies that we can use to help us with our emotions. We know some breathing techniques to help us when we feel upset or frustrated. We are learning how to soothe ourselves when we do feel sad.

We are continuing to play alongside our friends and are learning how to share with each other. We know that some things are ours, some things are our friends, and some things are everyone's.

Reading

This week we have been reading 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We like how the magic beans grew into a giant beanstalk. We have also been reading lots of stories with our teachers in our book corner.





Writing

To get ready to write we complete a 'Funky Fingers' challenge daily – this involves using the muscles in our fingers to complete the challenge. This strengthens the muscles what are used when we write; the challenge could be using tweezers to place pompoms along a pattern.
