Thank you also to all the staff in school that supported these two workshops. I am sure these will become a regular feature of our annual school calendar.


#### **Big Lent Walk**

## **Class Focus: High Flyers**

The High Flyers have been getting back in our normal routine after an amazing trip to Barnstondale. We continued with our recount topic in English. The children have worked so hard writing a detailed recount of their time in Barnstondale. They have also written an article each that will be compiled to create our very own Barnstondale magazine that will be available to download soon. In Maths, we had a productive week learning how to multiply fractions by integers. They eagerly absorbed every detail of each lesson, working hard to understand the complex concepts and steps involved.

In Science, we are midway through our Living Things and Their Habitats unit of work. The children loved learning all about the life cycle of frogs. We studied different stages of a frog's life, from eggs to tadpoles to fully-grown frogs and then made a diagram explaining each. In Geography, the children looked at different tourist destinations that British people travel to each year. They loved it but unfortunately it made us all want to go somewhere slightly warmer for the rest of the week! In History, we learned about how Anglo-Saxon kings maintained their position of power in society. The children produced fantastic pieces of work that explored how control was maintained by king Aethelberht.

It was our last week of swimming. I just wanted to say that all of the children have worked so hard over the last term. Every single child has improved consistently over that period. We even have some children who managed to swim 25 metres front crawl and backstroke in our final week! Well done Lily, Summer, Lucy, Albert and Emily.

Overall, it has been a great week filled with learning, fun and achievement!

Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.



We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.



Children and young people, who are eligible for benefits related free school meals, will be able to access hundreds of activities throughout the Easter break including specific provision available for children with SEND or additional needs, at **no cost to you**. There's a great range of activities across the city including **boxing, trampolining, football, music, dance, cycling, cooking, climbing, films, bowling, arts and crafts, drama, a make up course, trips out, Eurovision themed activities and much more!** Every day there will be a meal available for every child that attends.

There is no central booking system so please read the details of the programmes on the website and ring the providers directly.
