#### REMEMBERING THOSE WHO CHOSE ANOTHER WAY

Every year on 15th May, we remember conscientious objectors both past and present. Around the world, many people are imprisoned or forced to flee their homelands for refusing to join the armed forces.

On CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTORS DAY, we stand in solidarity with them, as well as celebrating the memory of those throughout history who have resisted conscription.

Here is the story one young man who refused to fight:

'In 1916 when compulsory military conscription was introduced to replace the vast number of men being killed and injured, Walter was 21. Like most people he could not quite understand why England was fighting the Germans who posed no threat, but unlike many young men he did not want to kill anyone, least of all total strangers who were doing him no harm.

Like tens of thousands of others, he refused to be conscripted and became a conscientious objector. Sentenced to hard labour, he died three months later of exposure in a cold leaking tent in a bleak quarry in Aberdeenshire.'
