# Class Focus: Hot Shots

This term in the Hot Shots classroom, we have learned a lot of new skills and have participated in exciting events in school, like going to the swimming baths for the first time this year and celebrating the Coronation of King Charles! Some of us are also preparing for our first Holy Communion over the next couple of weeks! We are improving and challenging ourselves each and every day. This is a flavour of what we are learning about...

**Maths** - As well as practising our times tables every day, we have been working extremely hard on fractions and decimals. Recently, we have been learning how to recognise tenths and hundredths as decimals and we are really excited to begin partitioning decimals, too!

**English** - We have been very creative this term, using our imagination to write our own mythical tale based on Theseus and the Minotaur - some of the stories have been very exciting, although the monsters have sounded absolutely terrifying! We have also been preparing to write an explanation text on another animal, using sharks and jellyfish as our inspiration!

**Science** - Our scientific investigations have taken us to learning more about Living Things and their Habitats, where we have discovered that there are different types of vertebrates and invertebrates. We have also recognised there are a variety of ways to classify animals into groups and we have had so much fun in classifying non-flowering plants!

**PE** - As well as playing tag rugby and practising our ball skills, we have been overjoyed to start our swimming lessons at the baths! Although we have only had a few lessons so far, we are loving getting into the water and taking ourselves out of our comfort zone. We absolutely LOVE swimming and it's all we talk about in class!

Wider Curriculum - In our wider curriculum lessons, we have been learning about many interesting topics. In

**History,** we have been exploring about Christianity and the Three Empires - we have really enjoyed learning all about the different types of Byzantine culture.

**Computing** - We have understood how much of an effect that words used online can have upon people and have learned how to STOP it from happening. As well as this, we have also carried on coding using Minecraft to allow us to perform various functions using a range of variables.

In **Come and See**, we have been learning all about Pentecost and studied different sources and pictures to recognize symbols that Jesus and his Spirit are always with us. As Father Fitz tells us whenever he comes into our class: when we light our candle, Jesus is alive and is always by our side!

# EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS



Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.




We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.

### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

### Barnardo's Action With Young Carers

Is commissioned to ensure that young carers and young adult carers up to the age of 25 years are identified and can receive a carers assessment under the statutory duty of Liverpool City Council.

### Who is a Young Carer?

A young carer is defined in law as a 'person under 18 who provides or intends to provide care to another person'. This includes 'providing practical or emotional support' (Children and Families Act 2014).

Action With Young Carers works with young carers and young adult carers who are caring for an ill or disabled adult. Some illnesses and disabilities can be seen others cannot.

### They can include;

- Physical illness or disability
- Learning disabilityMental health problems
- Drug or alcohol problems

We know that Young Carers often do not think of themselves as carers and it is important that you are recognised and get the support you need.

### What are some of the things a Young Carer might do?

Making sure they are alright

Helping them in and out of bed

Help them get washed and dressed

them out

and cooking

### Young Carers tell us that caring sometimes affects:

Their health, including physical, mental health and emotional wellbeing, making them feel:

- Anxious
- Worried
- · Tired because they are not getting enough sleep
- · Worn out with aches and pains

### Their school and college work:

- Feeling stressed
- Not having time to do homework
- Being bullied
- · Not being able to concentrate because of worry or being tired
- · Not being able to attend after school clubs or activities
- · Not being able to go on school trips

- · Having time with friends It can be difficult to go out with friends, sleep over at their house or have friends to their house
- · Not enough time to themselves and to do the things they enjoy

### How they feel about themselves:

- · Not knowing who to trust or who to talk to
- · Thinking they are the only one in this situation and no-one understands


