





Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.



We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

In the interest of your child's safety and well being, a named adult needs to be contactable at all times. Please ensure the school has at least 3 up to date telephone numbers. If school are unable to contact you and have concerns we may call the police and request a welfare check.

Can you please call school at the beginning of the day if your child is going to be absent.



National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (NSPCC) Assemblies

On Wednesday Mrs Birch will deliver NSPCC assemblies to years 1-6.

Overview

The film and information is designed for primary school children. They aim to help children understand: abuse in all its forms, including bullying; the ability to

recognise the signs of abuse; how to protect themselves from all forms of abuse; to make children aware of how to get help and the sources of help available to them, including Childline. There will be follow up lessons and workshops for years 5 & 6 delivered by hiidLine NSPCC staff.

The NSPCC would like to gather feedback from the juniors. A letter has gone home for parent's to sign if they do not wish the child to take part.





Parenting Support

Seeking Help

Anxiety becomes a problem for children when it starts to get in the way of their everyday life. If your child's anxiety is severe, persists and is starting to affect their wellbeing2, they may need some help. Tell your child's class teacher about your concerns.

In school we teach children the importance of having good mental health and emotional wellbeing and help them to talk about their feelings and build resilience. The class teacher may have already spotted some signs of anxiety in your child and can put some extra support in place

Schools can also have help and will have an internal pathway to support children who's anxiety is starting to affect their wellbeing

Other Ways To Ease Anxiety

- Stick to regular daily routines
 wherever possible
- Practise simple relaxation techniques with your child such as focused breathing, mindfulness or yoga.
- Make a 'worry box' where their worries can be held.
- Spend time on activities that allow your child to express themselves such as exercise, painting or baking.
- Spend quality time together and talk about other things.

What makes children anxious?

Children can feel anxious about different things at different ages. Many of these worries are a normal part of growing up.

Some children are more likely to have worries and anxiety than others and coronavirus has impacted on a lot od children.

Children often find change difficult and may become anxious following a house move or when starting in a new class or school.

Family arguments and conflicts can make children feel insecure and anxious.

Being around someone who is anxious can increase anxiety in children.

Children who have suffered separation, bereavement or any other distressing or traumatic experiences may suffer from anxiety afterwards.

Symptoms of Anxiety

Become irritable, tearful or clingy

- Have difficulty sleeping
- Wake in the night
- Have bad dreams
- Start wetting the bed
- Panic attacks, which can include having a racing heart, breathing very quickly, sweating or shaking
- Shallow or quick breathing, or feeling unable to breathe
- Feeling sick- 'butterflies in the tummy'
- Preoccupied by upsetting, scary or negative thoughts
- Finding it hard to concentrate

How to help your child manage Anxiety.

In a calmer moment talk with your child about their anxiety. Ask them what it feels like in their mind and body and what is making them feel that way.

Do not dismiss their worriesreassure them and show them you understand how they feel.

Whilst talking about their worries try to help them to find a solution. Are there changes that could be made at home or at school to ease the worry?

Explain to your child what anxiety is and the physical effects it can have on our bodies so they feel less frightened and overwhelmed next time it happens.

If you know a change is coming up, prepare your child by talking to them about what is going to happen and why.

Try not to become over protective or anxious yourself




