

Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.




We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

In the interest of your child's safety and well being, a named adult needs to be contactable at all times. Please ensure the school has at least 3 up to date telephone numbers. If school are unable to contact you and have concerns we may call the police and request a welfare check.

Parenting Support

If your child is woken by a nightmare:

- Comfort your child ands reassure them that they are safe
- Tell them it's a bad dream but its over
- Check under the bed or wardrobe if your child thinks there is something there
- Wait until the morning to talk about it
- Help them back to sleep by offering cuddly toy/ blanket, playing some quiet music, having a low light on

Nightmares

A leaflet for Parents and Carers to help support children

If your child is about to lose someone

If a child has a loved one, such as a family member or friend who's going to die, they can benefit from special support.

A childs stress level is often at its highest before bereavement because of the fear of the unknown.

Pre-bereavement counselling gives a child the chance to think and talk about their feelings and share their worries.

If you've a parent and you know you are going to die, you could make a memory box to give to your child or make one together. A memory box contains things that remind you both of your time together. It can provide— an important link between you and your child once you have gone.

Organisations such as Macmillan Cancer Support, Winston's Wish or Marie Curie provide information about supporting children when an adult is dying.

What are night terrors?

Night terrors are common in children ages 3-8 most children grow out of them.

Night terrors are more common in children with a family history of night terrors or sleep walking behavior.

Night terrors are very different from nightmares. A child experiencing a night terror may scream, shout and thrash around in extreme panic and may even jump out of bed.

Their eyes will be open but they're not fully awake.

Consult your GP if night terrors occur several times a night or most nights.

What causes nightmares?

The exact cause of nightmares isn't known. They're more likely when children are overtired or experiencing stress. Children who have experienced traumatic events may have frequent nightmares. Some medications may also cause nightmares or disturbing dreams.

Tips to reduce the risk of having a nightmare:

- Keep bedtime routine light and happy
- In the hour before bedtime don't watch/read anything that my be upsetting
- Make sure they get enough sleep
- Talk about the nightmare during the day
- A warm bath will help your child relax and get ready for sleep
- Keep lights dim






