Pupil Attendance and Punctuality

Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child's/children making progress and achieving success.

Good regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into the world of work.

Sometimes as parents/carers we maybe unsure if my child is too ill to go to school.

We have recently received some guidance from the DfE (Department for Education) and Chief Medical Officer about this.

Morning –Start of Day

Our school gates open at **8.40am** and close at **8.50am**. Learning begins at 8.50am. All children must be in school by this time. Gates will close promptly at **8.50am**.

Afternoon –End of day

Our school gates open at **3.20pm** and close at **3.30pm**. All children (unless in a club or after-school club) must be collected promptly. Children not collected will be supervised by staff and when picked up a member of senior staff will meet with parent/carer.

Children can only attend Sparkles if they have been booked in via the school App or made a call to school. (this latter option is only in case of emergency and you cannot pick up).





EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS




Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.



We aim for average school attendance to be 97%. There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

In the interest of your child's safety and well being, a named adult needs to be contactable at all times. Please ensure the school has at least 3 up to date telephone numbers. If school are unable to contact you and have concerns we may call the police and request a welfare check.

Can you please call school at the beginning of the day if your child is going to be absent.

Information

Dear Parent/Carer,

Your child's annual flu vaccination is now due.

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu.

Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help to protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

The vaccination is free and is a quick, simple and painless spray up the nose. Even if your child had the vaccine last year, the type of flu can vary each winter, so it is recommended to have it again this year or they won't be protected.

The nasal spray vaccine contains a very small amount of purified porcine gelatine as an essential ingredient to keep it stable and able to work. For those who may not accept medicines or vaccines that contain porcine gelatine, a flu vaccine injection is available. Since the programme was introduced, most children offered the vaccine in schools have had the immunisation.

If your child becomes wheezy, has a bad attack of asthma, or has started oral steroids for their asthma after you complete this form please contact the immunisation team

If you decide you do not want to vaccinate your child against flu, please complete their consent form giving the reason. This will help us plan and improve the service.

Please contact the immunisation team if you want to make any changes to your child's form after completing it, or you visit a GP for their flu immunisation.

Please remember it's important to ensure your child has received two doses of MMR and their other routine immunisations. This will ensure they are fully protected against vaccine preventable diseases.






