






Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.



We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

In the interest of your child's safety and well being, a named adult needs to be contactable at all times. Please ensure the school has at least 3 up to date telephone numbers. If school are unable to contact you and have concerns we may call the police and request a welfare check.

Measles: Are there different MMR vaccines?

You have probably heard a lot about measles in the news. There is a large outbreak in Birmingham mainly affecting children under 10 years old. Many children have needed to be admitted to hospital. Measles can cause serious problems including meningitis and hearing loss and can cause death.



The best way to protect against measles is to get two doses of the MMR vaccine.

There are two different versions of the MMR vaccine that are available for free through your GP. One of them contains gelatine and the other one doesn't.

They are both very effective and safe.

If you don't want the vaccine which contains gelatine, don't worry. You can still have the vaccine.

All you have to do is ring ahead to your GP practice and let them know, so they can have the right one ready for you. It's as simple as that.

Children are invited for their first dose of the MMR vaccine when they are between 12 and 13 months old and the second dose is given around 3 years and 4 months. Children can receive the vaccine at any age after this, so if your child has missed either of these doses or you are not sure just contact your GP practice.

- if your child is due to have had 2 doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible*
- if you can't remember if your child has had any, 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your GP
- if you don't know how man doses your child has had, it's better to have 2 doses of MMR vaccine now rather than risk leaving them unprotected

*In response to a local outbreak then the 2 doses can be given one month apart from the age of 18 months.




