This week, the Champions have certainly lived up to their name! Everyone in our class has worked amazingly hard across all subjects this week.




Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.



Should I keep my child off school?

Yes Until...

- Chickpox: at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over.
- Diarrhoea and Vomiting: 48 hours after their last episode.
- Cold and the flu (see the leaflet COVID-19): 7 days after their last episode, unless they have a confirmed or suspected COVID-19 infection.
- Measles: 4 days after the rash first appeared.
- Mumps: 5 days after the swelling started.
- Scarlet: they no longer have their symptoms.
- Scrub typhus: 48 hours after they started taking antibiotics.
- Whooping Cough: 48 hours after they started taking antibiotics.

No But make sure you let your school or nursery know about...

- Head lice and nits: Washable hair.
- Hand, foot and mouth: Washable hands.
- Throat issues: Sore throat.

We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

In the interest of your child's safety and well being, a named adult needs to be contactable at all times. Please ensure the school has at least 3 up to date telephone numbers. If school are unable to contact you and have concerns we may call the police and request a welfare check.

Can you please call school at the beginning of the day if your child is going to be absent.

Measles: Are there different MMR vaccines?



You have probably heard a lot about measles in the news. There is a large outbreak in Birmingham mainly affecting children under 10 years old. Many children have needed to be admitted to hospital. Measles can cause serious problems including meningitis and hearing loss and can cause death.

The best way to protect against measles is to get two doses of the MMR vaccine.

There are two different versions of the MMR vaccine that are available for free through your GP. One of them contains gelatine and the other one doesn't.

They are both very effective and safe.

If you don't want the vaccine which contains gelatine, don't worry. You can still have the vaccine.

All you have to do is ring ahead to your GP practice and let them know, so they can have the right one ready for you. It's as simple as that.

Children are invited for their first dose of the MMR vaccine when they are between 12 and 13 months old and the second dose is given around 3 years and 4 months. Children can receive the vaccine at any age after this, so if your child has missed either of these doses or you are not sure just contact your GP practice.

MEASLES
Don't let your child catch it
- get them vaccinated with the MMR vaccine

- measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated
- measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain. Measles can kill
- your child is at risk of measles if he or she hasn't had the MMR vaccination
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection
- if your child is due to have had 2 doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible*
- if you can't remember if your child has had any, 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your GP
- if you don't know how many doses your child has had, it's better to have 2 doses of MMR vaccine now rather than risk leaving them unprotected

*In response to a local outbreak then the 2 doses can be given one month apart from the age of 18 months.

- imunizați-l cu vaccinul MMR (impotriva rujelei, oreionului și a rubeolei)

- Rujeola a revenit în actualitate. Au existat focare epidemice grave în Țara Galilor și Anglia, iar numărul copiilor care se îmbolnăvesc de rujeolă este în creștere.
- Rujeola poate fi o boală foarte gravă, care poate duce la infecții la nivelul urechilor și al toraxului, crize, diaree și leziuni ale creierului. Rujeola poate ucide.
- Copilul dumneavoastră este expus riscului îmbolnăvirii cu rujeolă dacă nu a fost imunizat împotriva rujelei, oreionului și rubeolei.

- Dacă copilului dumneavoastră trebuie să i se administreze cele două doze de vaccin MMR împotriva rujelei, oreionului și rubeolei, dar încă nu le-a primit, indiferent de vârsta acestuia, trebuie să vă adresați medicului de familie pentru a-l vaccina cât mai curând posibil. *
- Dacă nu vă puteți aminti dacă copilului i s-au administrat una sau două doze de vaccin MMR împotriva rujelei, oreionului și rubeolei, verificați fișa medicală a copilului (Cartețelul Roșu). Dacă acest lucru nu vă ajută, adresați-vă medicului de familie.
- Dacă nu știți câte doze i s-au administrat copilului dumneavoastră, este mai bine ca să primiți acum cele două doze de vaccin MMR împotriva rujelei, oreionului și rubeolei decât să riscați să îl lăsați neprotejat.

*Ca răspuns la un focar epidemic local, cele două doze pot fi administrate la o lună distanță între ele, începând cu vârsta de 18 luni.

Unele dintre întrebările frecvente despre rujeolă și vaccinul MMR împotriva rujelei, oreionului și rubeolei sunt trecute pe reversul acestei broșuri.

MEASLES
Ochroń swoje dziecko przed zarażeniem się
- zaszczepi je przeciw odry, śwince i różyczce (szczepionka MMR)

- Odra znów pojawia się w wiadomościach. Na terenie Wali i Anglii odnotowano znaczny wzrost zachorowań, zwiększa się liczba dzieci zarażonych odry.
- Odra jest groźną chorobą, która może prowadzić do zapalenia ucha, infekcji dróg oddechowych, drgawek, biegunki oraz uszkodzenia mózgu. Odra może prowadzić do śmierci.
- Zachorowaniem na odrę zagrożone są dzieci, którym nie podano szczepionki MMR.
- Najlepszą ochronę zapewniają dwie dawki.
- Jeżeli dziecku nie podano zalecanych dwóch dawek szczepionki MMR, należy skontaktować się z lekarzem pierwszego kontaktu i zaszczepić je jak najszybciej, niezależnie od jego wieku. *
- W razie niepewności, czy dziecko zostało zaszczepione lub czy podano mu jedną, czy dwie dawki szczepionki MMR, należy sprawdzić jego książeczkę zdrowia (Red Book). Można również skontaktować się z przychodnią lekarską.
- Jeżeli nie wiadomo, ile dawek szczepionki otrzymało dziecko, lepiej podać mu dwie dawki szczepionki MMR niż ryzykować pozostawienie go bez ochrony.

*Dzięki w odpowiedzi na lokalny wzrost zachorowań można podać dziecku dwie dawki szczepionki w odstępie jednego miesiąca po ukończeniu przez nie 18. miesiąca życia.

- إذا كان من المقرر أن يصاب طفلك بمرض الحصبة ولكن لم يتلقاها بعد، فبعض النظر عن العمر، يجب عليك الاتصال بطبيبك للحصول على تطعيم في أقرب وقت ممكن.*
- إذا كنت لا تستطيع تذكر ما إذا كان طفلك قد تلقى أي جرعة أو أخذ جرعة واحدة أو جرعتين من تطعيم MMR، فتحدث من سجل صحة الطفل الشخصي (الدفتر الأحمر). إذا لم يساعد ذلك، فتحدث إلى طبيبك.
- إذا كنت لا تعرف عدد الجرعات التي قد تلقاها طفلك، فمن الأفضل إخطارك بجرعتين من لقاح MMR الآن بدلاً من المخاطرة بتراكم دون حماية.
- الحصبة في الأجيال مرة أخرى. كانت هناك تطعيمات خطيرة في ويلز و إنجلترا و عدد الأطفال المصابين بالحصبة في ارتفاع.
- يمكن أن تكون الحصبة مرضًا خطيرًا، و تشنجات، و إسهال، و تلف للمخ. يمكن الحصبة أن تقتل.
- يكون طفلك معرضًا لخطر الحصبة إذا لم تكن قد تلقى لقاح MMR.
- هناك حاجة إلى جرعتين من لقاح MMR للحصول على أفضل حماية.

*في حالة استجابة لانتشار محلي للعدوى، يمكن إعطاء الجرعتين وتلقيهما بينهما شهرًا واحدًا بعد 18 شهرًا.





