Spotlight on : Pupil Attendance and Punctuality

Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child's/children making progress and achieving success.

Good regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into the **Attendance Matters** world of work.



Sometimes as parents/carers we may be unsure if our child is too ill to go to school.

Please have a look at some guidance from the DfE (Department for Education) and Chief Medical Officer about this.

Morning –Start of Day

Our school gates open at 8.40am and close at 8.50am. Learning begins at 8.50am. All children must be in school by this time. Gates will close promptly at 8.50am.

We still have families arriving at after 8.50am at the gate. This is late. Staff will give a school punctuality leaflet to all families arriving at the school gate after this time as a reminder that the start of day has begun. A late start to the day has a negative impact on a children's learning and well-being.

Well done to all the families that arrive on time each day.

Afternoon –End of day

Our school gates open at 3.20pm and close at 3.30pm. All children (unless in a club or after-school club) must be collected promptly. Children not collected will be supervised by staff and when picked up a member of senior staff with meet with parent/carer.

We have an increasing number of children not being collected on time. This is not fair on the child/children and staff. If you are going to be late you must contact the school office and inform us so we can make supervision arrangements. This should only be required in emergency situations.

After School Clubs

Children registered to these clubs after school must be picked up at the agreed time. We are very fortunate that our staff are happy to give up their time to lead these clubs. So it is unfair when children are not picked up on time and staff are supervising children way after the end of the club.







We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.






