Transition to new classes in September 2024

On Thursday we shared with you and the children who will be their new teacher in September and which class they will be in.

To help support all the children with a smooth transition we have planned a number of transition sessions and activities.

On Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July and Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> July the children will meet their new teacher in their new classroom. These will be half day sessions. The children will experience a selection of activities to give them a little flavour of next year's curriculum.

All children will be given a 'Transition Booklet' which they will start completing in school and bring home to share with you and complete over the summer.

Year 2 moving to Year 3 will be given a tour of the junior building and the outside play areas.

We will also be sharing some additional information for parents/carers on how you can help prepare your child/children: **'Top Ten Tips for preparing your child for change'**.

Year 6 children moving to senior school in September will have some additional transition webinars and workshops to support their move.

### Aspire and Achieve Week Monday 24<sup>th</sup> June – Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June

As always we've had a busy week of Aspire and Achieve to promote attendance in school. This year, the children were thrilled to meet Andrew Francis, who has specially flown out from Seattle just to visit our school. He is a good friend of one of our staff members. Andrew has worked on the game Roblox for ten years, and delivered special Roblox workshops to children in Key Stage Two over 3 days.

The children also met World Champion Boxer and martial artist, Tony Moran. He talked to the children about how hard he'd worked in life to get where he is today. They also had three assemblies from Gillian Seale, a wonderful children's author and illustrator who came to talk about her books and pictures.

We've had visits from all three emergency services. The fire brigade, an ambulance and the police. They even brought their vehicles for the children to look at and the fire brigade let the children use their hose on the yard! Search and rescue also came in to show their vehicles and equipment.

There have been diversity workshops, tax facts workshops from HMRC, an ice cream entrepreneur, an aerial gymnast, civil servants, AI startups, a musician, an astrologist, a speech and language therapist, an artist, a CIC group who promote zero waste, a maritime lawyer, a maritime engineer, a dancer, Daisy Inclusive UK, a makeup artist, a football coach, an NHS data specialist and many more.

All of these people have given up their time for free, to come and talk to our wonderful children and all have expressed how lovely it was to spend time in St Michael's.



Regular attendance at school is the single most important factor in a child/children making appropriate progress and achieving success. Good, regular and punctual attendance means doing well academically, developing better relationships with other children and positive behaviour. It also sets up good habits for when young people enter into work and life.




We aim for average school attendance to be 97% There are 190 days in a school year which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, shopping, appointments and other things.

It is also important to arrive at school on time. If a child arrives late to school every day, their learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.

### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

In the interest of your child's safety and well being, a named adult needs to be contactable at all times. Please ensure the school has at least 3 up to date telephone numbers. If school are unable to contact you and have concerns we may call the police and request a welfare check.

Can you please call school at the beginning of the day if your child is going to be absent.

A kinship carer is a person looking after someone else's child because their parents are unable to care for them. You might be a grandparent, auntie, uncle, sibling, or friend. You might be caring for very young children or teenagers. You might be new to kinship caring or you may have been doing it for many years.

How can Kinship Carers Support You? Kinship caring is both rewarding and challenging. Some families face difficulties at different stages of the kinship family journey. You are caring for others but who is caring for you? We are here to give you advice, information and support. We provide an Activities Programme for kin kids and carers - and can introduce you to other kin families locally


