GOSPEL THOUGHTS Mark 8:27-35

Lovers are only delighted at the beginning of life's great adventure. Parents can be full of awe at the sight of their first born. Love and parenthood develops and resilience is needed with all the joy. We can rush to do a task and only find out slowly that



much more is needed than enthusiasm. Jesus' friends slowly move beyond hero worship. They return from being sent to neighbouring towns and villages, excited and

reporting to their 'hero'. Jesus was getting the reputation of a prophet. All the prophets ended up rejected, resisted and some of them killed.

Loving his friends, Jesus began to teach them that there was trouble ahead. Calling people to change and treat each other with friendship and forgiveness will be challenging. Such instructions would be met with refusal and even anger.

Peter, protesting, was proof of that process and Jesus gets tough with him. Do we follow Jesus in our relationships or settle with Peter and not get the difficult part of the task done?
