A lot of us only read the instructions when things go wrong. Whether it is the dashboard in the car or the computer, we have settled for "my way".

God's word is our instruction book as we are made in God's image. Jesus

shows how to use Lent by setting some time aside to listen to God; perhaps by reading the Gospel. In today's readings, we see Moses calling the people aside to remember to thank God for their harvest. Next, we see Jesus set aside time to decide what to do next. He refuses three times things that do not come from God; he refuses selfish acts and follows the Holy Spirit (God's way of doing things).
