EASTER PEACE THOUGHTS

A conscientious objector is any person who, for reasons of conscience or profound conviction, refuses to perform service in the armed forces or any other direct or indirect participation in armed conflicts, including refusal to participate because one disagrees with its aims or the manner in which it is being waged.

Today, many young Israelis, who face compulsory conscription, are refusing to fight in the war Israel is waging in the Occupied West Bank and in Gaza against Palestinians.

One such objector is 20-year-old Yuval Dag, who made his objection to military service on grounds of conscience.

The army considers his refusal as 'the disobeying of orders' and he is currently imprisoned in Neve Tzedek military prison.

Yuval wrote

'I will not take part in, 'military invasions, violence, killings and oppression, which affect so many Palestinians and which has become the norm. The body responsible for executing this project is the Israeli military. Therefore, I refuse to give my body and my life to any system, or any country, and, in the current situation, especially not to the state of Israel and the Israeli military'.

As International Conscientious Objectors' Day, 15th May, is marked around the world to raise awareness of the struggles of conscientious objectors, let us remember them and pray for Yuval and all who refuse to fight in wars.


