'Don't mention the children. Don't name the dead children. The people must not know the names of the dead children.

The people must be protected from knowing the names of the children.

The names of the children could spread like wildfire.

The names of the children could spread like wildfire.

The people would not be safe if they knew the names of the children. Don't name the dead children. Don't remember the dead children. Don't think of the dead children. Don't say: 'dead children'.


GOSPEL THOUGHTS: Luke 16: 19 - 31
