All merciful God, you dwell in all human hearts,
heal these broken places where prophets preached,
where Moses and Jesus and Muhammad kept faith with you.

and make us all, however far away, steadfast in their cause.

Our Lady, Queen of Palestine and Queen of Peace,
pray for us and for all who live in your 'holy' land.
