His poem sums up the futility and the immense loss caused by war.

WASTE

Waste of muscle, waste of brain; waste of patience, waste of pain. Waste of humanity, waste of health; waste of beauty, waste of wealth. Waste of blood, and waste of tears; waste of youth's most precious years. Waste of ways the saints have trod; waste of glory, waste of God - War!

Therefore, as we remember, let us not look away from the wars happening now - let us march, listen, write, help, bear witness, use our power and our privilege; let us learn and understand why men, women and children are lying, their limbs crushed, under the rubble of war today.
