Follows four women as they attempt to bring to justice, Aaron Swan, serial predator and sex abuser.

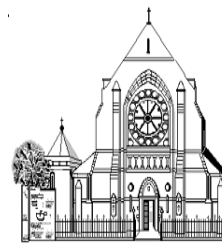
WEDNESDAY 9.00pm BBC2: REFORM: READY TO RULE?

THURSDAY 9.00PM BBC2: I AM NOT OK: SPOTLIGHT

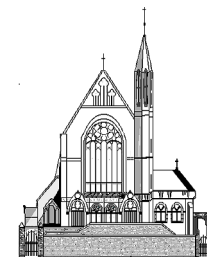
Mothers of autistic children share their struggle to cope as they raise their children with severe and complex needs.

REMEMBER THE CHILDREN - AN INVITATION

Over the months, a small group has been working to create a lasting memorial to the 20,000+ Palestinian; 31 Israeli children and 8 Bedouin children killed in the Israel/Gaza war.

The Memorial, displayed on our Lady's Altar, contains 11,500 children's names. We now need to add the names of the other 9,000+ Palestinian children, who have been killed in Gaza, by the Israeli Occupying Forces, despite a ceasefire. To this end, you are warmly invited to join us

on Wednesday, 4th February in St. Michael's at 12.30pm.

We share a soup lunch to begin, then start writing the names at 1.00pm.

This is gentle, yet powerful act of solidarity and remembrance.
